Madison, IN: Bronkella takes an opportunity with Center Grove High School

Nearly five years ago, In July 2017, Madison Consolidated Schools named Joe Bronkella as the new Athletic Director. Since then, Madison Athletics has undergone significant improvements in all aspects of operations, implementation of participant-enhancing technology, multiple facilities upgrades, intentionally student-focused initiatives and programs to develop leadership, and an unwavering commitment to integrity and

accountability among coaches and student-athletes.

It is those achievements that caught the attention of Center Grove High School where Bronkella will take over as the new athletic director as of July 1, 2022.

"I have truly enjoyed my time in Madison", shared Bronkella. "I have met incredible students, have worked with some very passionate coaches, been witness to incredible teams and student successes across the board, and have been fortunate enough to be heavily involved in a number of capital projects that have created incredible facilities and competition areas for our student-athletes to call home. It is these things that I feel have prepared me to take the next step in my career at a larger school."

During his tenure at Madison, Bronkella has:

- Rebuilt the direction and focus of the Athletic Department through collaboration and stakeholder engagement.
- Provided guidance in working with coaches to shift to a college-like approach to creating their staff, outlining program goals, working toward vertical alignment, and development of youth programming partnerships as feeder programs.
- Created contracted relationships that created financial gain and opportunities to positively impact students, teams, and programs by working with vendors such as Pepsi, Adidas, Final Forms, Norton Health, and Mad City CrossFit.
- Created a branded, timely, and positive student-centered social media presence to celebrate all sports with a focus on proactive communication.
- Operated with fairness and equality in regard to department decisions and discipline of athletes and coaches. This included the implementation of the appeal/hearing process, the creation of student handbooks, and the creation of the Student Athletic Council - developing a culture for prioritizing student voice.
- Proactively sought out ways to consistently improve the department and services it provided.
- Routinely presented new ideas to support the improvements of facilities, programs, coaches development, and mentoring opportunities for coaches and student-athletes.
- A tireless approach to building positive relationships with staff and officials.

It is likely his 'get it done and done impeccably 'approach to work that provided Bronkella with the opportunity to take on a much larger task with Center Grove. Located in Greenwood, IN, and home to the Trojans, CGHS boasts a student body enrollment of approximately 2,600 students. "It is a much larger student population than Madison," Bronkella continued. "I look very forward to taking some of the things I have learned and implemented in my time here and working to implement them in my new position."

At the time of his hire, the department was operating near the 'red' financially - staring at more expenses than it had funds to cover. In five years, the department soared a healthy surplus of funds and he has built a system where all coaches are responsible for their fundraising, manage their own budgets, and spend according to their needs. "As a department, we have created a process by which all teams are in a rotation for uniforms, equipment, and venue enhancements that fall outside of the capital projects budget," he explained. "We have a process by which the student-athletes and coaches work together to determine their needs, raise the funds necessary to purchase outside items, and are accountable for that funding."

In addition, Bronkella has worked to create a system that has incorporated all athletics for both the high school and junior high school in one place through the FinalForms and EventLink systems. Efficiently able to manage schedules, staffing, and a complete student management system for all sports across both schools - these systems have led to a much more efficient and streamlined approach to enrollment for parents and students. In addition, technology has enabled the implementation of live-streaming events from most venues so that Cub fans can watch a number of events from anywhere.
