# **DISCUSSION INFORMATION**

# **EVOLUTION OF MEDIA CENTERS – MS. LINDA BRINEGAR**

Ms. Brinegar presented the following: "Good evening. My name is Linda Brinegar, and I am the Media Specialist for Madison Consolidated Schools. I'm here this evening to describe to you changes occurring in Libraries, and, more particularly changes in our libraries in our schools.

Traditionally, libraries have been quiet, studious places for students and patrons to read, study and circulate print resources. Wall are typically lined with shelves anchored to them, and there may be heavy tables and chairs where patrons quietly read or study. With resources now available in so many different formats, and group and teamwork

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being more common than individual work, the quiet, somber spaces of the past have become pretty irrelevant to the way people learn, think, search, find information, and work these days.

There is a major shift on the Library scene where library spaces are moving from the traditional space to "Learning Commons" spaces (also referred to as "Information Commons" or "Student Commons" spaces). The Learning Commons is a space where students are free to collaborate, participate, learn, mentor, think, teach, invent, discover, read, inquire, research, make, plan, produce, showcase, and create.

Learning Commons spaces are characterized by flexible design elements with moveable furnishings (tables, chairs, bookshelves), and open spaces that invite group work and collaboration. But it's not just the physical spaces that define Learning Commons; it's also the activity taking place inside these spaces. Creating instructional partnerships among faculty of different departments, with each other, and also with me, the District Media Specialist, to facilitate student engagement will be the goal. We can work together as facilitators of learning and co-construction of understanding from a variety of resources of varying formats (both print and e-sources).

We are beginning by transforming our elementary libraries into Learning Commons spaces, which will include student learning "centers" that will change throughout the year. In these Centers, students will explore and engage in activities, some technology-based, some building-based (engineering), some with a creativity-base (arts), but all will in some way relate to the STEAM movement (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Math).

Students will also check-out books when they visit the Learning Commons centers. Book circulation is transitioning to an automated format, using the same circulation system we have in place, and with no additional hardware required. Automated circulation of books is empowering students to check-out books themselves, while freeing the Learning Commons Leader in each building, so that she or he won't have to be tied to the circulation desk any longer; he or she will be free to move around the space, facilitating the exploring and learning taking place, and assisting students in finding the materials they need.

Many thanks to Dr. Bolinger and Dr. Jenner for their commitment in progressing our libraries into Learning Commons spaces that will be relevant to the way our students learn, and for always doing what's best for our students. Thank you for the support of our program."
