Celebration Edition Celebrating our Employees!

For the first time since the 2019-2020 school year, MCS hosted an in-person employee celebration on May 30, 2023. "We are so thankful for each of you and the difference you make for our students daily," stated Superintendent Dr. Teresa Brown as she kicked off the event. "Every single one of us is an educator in some way, each of us has the opportunity to touch a student's life simply by being a presence in their daily life with a kind word or gesture - every single one of us makes a difference."

The day began with a breakfast for the entire district prepared and served by our MCHS Cafe team. Sweets, savories, and something for everyone as several of the district's 400+ employees filled the cafeteria with lots of stories and laughter. The festivities then moved into the Opal E. Sherman Auditorium where service anniversaries from 5 years to 43 years were celebrated, retirees were recognized, and for the first time, the district's Teacher and Employee of the Year were recognized in front of all of their peers. "I think it is so important for all of us to gather a few times a year," shared Brown during her presentation. "We haven't all been together since opening day and it is nice to be able to celebrate another successful year together."

This year's morning event was a change from the evening event of prior years. Retirees were encouraged to bring their families to share their special day and were able to enjoy stories and memories as shared by each employee's supervisor.

There were 64 employees with five to eight years of service who were sent a gift card ahead of the celebration. Ten and fifteen-year anniversaries were recognized with a gift card, a rose, and recognition during the convocation. Employees with more than 20 years of service also received a gift card (all in incremental amounts based on year), a rose, and a personalized plaque, and ten retirees were recognized and received all of the above, as well as, a framed, signed print of an original painting of one of three Madison community landmarks created by MCHS teacher and local artist Aaron Kelsey. In all, the district recognized 159 employees ranging from five to forty-three years of service.
