Mr. Glesing said he had been concerned about the cost of the project but the Task Force narrowed the cost down to what is needed. He said if nothing is done it will cost in the long run. Mr. Glesing said he hopes the community supports the referendum.

Mr. Bass said we couldn't have gotten this far without the Task Force. He said it wouldn't have been right for the Board to tackle this on their own. He said the decision was community driven. Mr. Bass thanked the Task Force.
