Mr. Glesing asked if phased out iPads could be utilized at the Preschool.

Mrs. laCour asked if student performance tracking would be done on students once they leave preschool. Mrs. McKay said tracking would be necessary. She said they are working on the implementation.

Mr. Kring asked why there were so many students on the voucher wait list. Dr. Jenner said there wasn't enough funding. Mr. Glesing said he had a heated discussion with the Governor when he turned down 80 million Federal dollars which was to be used for early education.

Dr. Studebaker-Bolinger thanked Mrs. McKay and encouraged the Board to visit the preschool.

BOND ISSUANCE UPDATE – Mrs. Hensler

Mrs. Hensler said our credit rating is outstanding due to the Board being proactive with the declining enrollment. She said she submitted the financial date.

Mrs. Hensler said our credit rating is an A+ and received a AA+ on the sale of the bonds. Mrs. Hensler said the bids where done by Umbaugh on October 28 in the ranges of 1.24% up to 2.19%. Mrs. Hensler said the 1.24% will save our corporation \$140,000 in interest. She said we did very well on the bond bid and Umbaugh was very pleased. Mrs. Hensler said the closing was scheduled for November 17th.

Dr. Studebaker-Bolinger said RPF's had been sent for an architect. She said she would bring the recommendation to the December board meeting.

REPORTS

STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE

Miss Lexi Bennett gave the following report:

- We had a competitive fall season in sports and now we are moving on to the winter seasons with wrestling, swimming, and basketball. Some of our pep section students received free passes for games which was a nice gesture for our athletic department to make. Our sports would love to have the community come out and support these teams.
- Our marching band had a fantastic season; they worked very hard and put on a great show.
- I wanted to thank all of the teachers who helped putting on the basketball game for the education foundation.
- I wanted to personally thank our teachers that work over at Ivy Tech because I know it is a lot of work and a different environment but this first semester has been amazing.
- Once again, the school lunches are getting better and better. Mr. Yancey said that he had more people go up and say positive things about the lunches than he has ever had before. The after school food that is provided is such a great idea and we as students thank you for helping make that possible.
- I wanted to thank and acknowledge my AP government class for taking time out of their November 3rd eLearning day to help some candidates with working the polls. It was a great experience to learn more about the government system.

- Today we hosted the Veteran's Day service at the high school, where I saw many of you in the audience. Mr. Glesing, I thank you for your service. Also a thank you to FFA, band, choir, Team Lead, and Mr. Rusk's AP US History class for helping the service run smoothly.
- Coming up on the high school schedule, our theater department is putting on their production of Mary Poppins from November 19-22. It is by far the most technical play we have put on; we have students walking on the ceiling and flying and the show is going to be outstanding. It would be a great show to go and see and support.

SUPERINTENDENT

Dr. Studebaker-Bolinger said Mary Poppins will be a wonderful show.

Dr. Studebaker-Bolinger said the cafeterias have been serving new items: Chinese dish, steak bites, and will be serving Cornish hen and steak in December.

Dr. Studebaker-Bolinger said the Veteran's Day Program was wonderful.

Dr. Studebaker-Bolinger said she has met with each principal to discuss their dashboards and review evidence of student achievement.

Dr. Studebaker-Bolinger said Board members recently attended the ISBA Fall Region Meeting and the Southeastern Career Center for dinner and a building tour.

Dr. Studebaker-Bolinger informed the Board ISTEP scores had been distributed. She said there have been declines in the test scores. Dr. Studebaker-Bolinger said some schools will have a 30% decrease in scores. She said we have great teacher and students who work hard every day. She said they deserve better. Dr. Studebaker-Bolinger said there are flaws in the State assessment system. Mr. Kring asked if this wasn't anticipated. Dr. Studebaker-Bolinger said the 4th & 8th graders who took a National Assessment had an increase in scores. Mr. Kring asked how this will impact teacher evaluations.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Mr. Kring gave the following legislative update:

Referendums

a. Allow accurate ballot language. If a school corporation is paying off old debt in order to neutralize the tax impact of a referendum, it is not allowed to state so on a ballot. The school corporation can only state it is raising taxes. (IC 6-1.1-20-3.6).

Talking Point

- Placing inaccurate referendum language on ballots leaves the voter with a feeling that they were misled during
- the campaign. The ballot language prescribed by the Department of Local Governmental Finance causes
- this confusion.
- b. Allow mail-in balloting as a corporation option. This would allow voters to get more information before casting their ballot.

Talking Point

• Mail in balloting would simply be another option for schools to consider. It gives the option of a single ballot election without the cost of a special election.

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Mr. Glesing gave the following legislative update:

Tax Incremental Financing

a. School board representatives should have voting rights on redevelopment commissions. Schools are the most important driver of economic growth in a community. Board representatives should be an essential part of any redevelopment commission. (IC 3-7-14-6.1)

Talking Point

- Schools are the most important part of any community and along with redevelopment commissions, play a very
- Important part in economic development. Since TIFs (Tax Incremental Financing) can also have a negative financial impact on schools, school representatives on redevelopment commissions should have voting rights.
- b. School Corporations should automatically receive a small percentage of TIF bond money. (IC 36-7-14-39)

Talking Point

• Many redevelopment commissions voluntarily give local school districts a small percentage of an economic development bond issue. Others give local schools nothing. Since TIFs do affect local school tax revenue, a small percentage of a bond issue would neutralize any negative impact.

Mr. Glesing encouraged people to talk to their legislatures.

BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS

Mrs. L. Imel said she was impressed with the students during the Veteran's Day Program.

Mr. Kring said he was very excited about the Preschool and how well it is doing. Mr. Kring stated concerns about the poverty level and the need for those children in poverty have the opportunity to attend preschool. He said education is the driving force to break the poverty cycle. Mr. Kring said he would like to see sponsors for children in our community.

Mr. Kring wished all a Happy Veteran's Day.

Mrs. laCour thanked Mrs. McKay for the presentation and the job she is doing at the Preschool.

Mrs. laCour said she was amazed with what is happening at the Southeastern Career Center. She said one of the high school students from the Culinary Arts program served dinner. Mrs. laCour said the diesel mechanics and criminal justice programs are excellent.

Mr. Glesing thanked the community for their support at the Education Foundation basketball fundraising event. He said they took in \$4,424.00.

Mr. Glesing commended the Veteran's Day program at the High School. He said the band and choir were outstanding.

Mr. Glesing said there are really good things happening at the Career Center. He said approximately 20 students graduate each year from the diesel mechanics class. Mr. Glesing said the Career Center receives calls from all over the mid-west trying to hire graduates from the diesel mechanics class.

Mr. Glesing asked if our ISTEP scores were worse off than other school districts. He said we need to put it in perspective.

Mr. Glesing said Preschool has always been a priority for him.

Mrs. J. Imel commended the high school students, staff and administration for making the veteran's comfortable at the program.

Mrs. J. Imel encouraged everyone to visit the Career Center. She had no idea how expansive it was.

Mrs. J. Imel thanked Lexi for her report.

Mrs. J. Imel recognized the directors and corporation attorney.
