  - c. Total Monthly Investment: \$4,118.36
- 2. Trade-in / Sell current copiers that Madison Consolidated owns.

Dr. Studebaker-Bolinger said this new agreement would save the corporation \$1,500 a month. She said as a corporation we made 4.8 million copies last year. Mrs. J. Imel said that was down from previous years.

## APPROVAL OF AGREEMENT TO PROVIDE ATHLETIC FIELD SERVICES
